She claims that, "I've made some good friends which are a treasure to me. I've been amazed at the difference Free Rein has made in so many lives. She is now excited to be with us and even gives hugs, even to me her horse leader. OH, what a blessing it was to witness such a change in on little girl's life."

One thing that Janet has said is on her "bucket list" is riding horses. As part of her volunteer efforts she gets to ride some of our horses in order to exercise them and keep them in tip-top condition for our classes.

Free Rein is a family destination for Mary & Damian Tody and their three children, who travel from Hendersonville to the Free Rein stable once a week during every available session. The most excited member of the family is usually Avrey (shown at right with Lois & Clark, Free Rein's "spokes-horses").

Avrey was diagnosed with Cerebral Palsy, a disorder of movement, muscle tone or posture at the age of one. Riding a horse has been a wonderful gift to Avrey and the Todys. Mary says that his gross motor skills have improved markedly. He sits up straight with little support now and his self esteem has blossomed.

He just completed his fifth session at Free Rein. He was three when he started riding Lacy. But when Cloud was introduced to him later there was an instant connection. But as Avrey has grown the fit between horse and rider has changed. He has graduated to Kasey is she is now his ride of choice. "She has a smooth gate and the fit is terrific", says Mary.

"We love it there and the Free Rein family is part of our family. While Avrey rides, Damian serves as a side walker and our other two children always feed the other horses carrots and treats," says Mary. She quickly says that if there were year round sessions they would be there sharing the joy of her son's improvements with his instructor Christina, horse leader Porsha, and side walker Andy. It is a fabulous family affair for them which will continue.
