Free Rein is the only PATH International member center in Transylvania, Henderson or Buncombe counties. We work extremely hard to keep lesson fees low. Scholarship assistance is available to those who qualify and that's where **we need your help**.

Sessions are supervised by PATH Int'l Certified Instructors and Equine Specialists who have undergone a stringent certification process and possess a strong equine background as well as an understanding of various disabilities through continuing education based on the annually updated *PATH Int'l Standards for Certification and Accreditation*.

5 Steps to Help Students Prepare for a Successful Fall Session

- 1. Prior to the session, begin reminding your student about what to expect at Free Rein. Talk about the horses, the barn and what they'll be doing.
- 2. If you have a calendar or schedule make sure students begin to realize that Free Rein is part of their fall schedule. Visual reminders are a great way for students to feel comfortable about their upcoming activities.
- 3. Set out riding attire. After the summer it may be advisable to have students to begin wearing pants, closed toed shoes or any other clothes they have not been wearing.
- 4. Once goals are set with the instructors, identify ways you can support those goals at home.
- 5. Help your student to Go with the Flow by discussing that they will be experiencing new situations, surroundings and smells. It's okay to be nervous but they'll have fun and be safe.





Transylvania Vocational Services Life Skills & Interact Partners

For over a decade, Free Rein has partnered with Transylvania Vocational Services. It has been a wonderful relationship serving roughly 25 students each session. Over the years we have witnessed remarkable accomplishments. Participants have improved their cognitive and social skills as well as increased physical strength and coordination. Perhaps the best part is watching the group's bright smiles when they get to the barn and enjoying their bubbly personalities.

In case you don't know, TVS provides opportunities for community integration and inclusion. Services are provided in group settings or one-on-one to meet the identified needs of the individual in the areas of communication, socialization, and daily living skills. Services provide instruction and assistance to enable the individual to acquire and maintain skills that will allow him or her to function with greater independence in the community.
